Items
Site Protocols / Emergency Procedures FH explained the site protocols/emergency procedures with the group attending the meeting at the Roydon Quarry office.
Purpose reiterated The purpose of the CLG must include, but not be limited to, the following: i) Engagement on an on-going and regular basis on matters associated with the quarrying operations including compliance with CRC resource consents; ii) Promotion of the flow of information relating to all District and Regional consents relating to the quarry including dust monitoring data (including location), metrological data, water abstraction data and groundwater quality data via a publicly available electronic sharing platform, established, operated and maintained by the consent holder to be utilised by the local community and the consent holder so as to, wherever possible, address any issues that may arise; and iii) To discuss the results of monitoring and any matters that may arise as a result of the monitoring
Previous Minutes The previous minutes were discussed and amended and approved by the group as a correct record. They can now be put onto the website.
CLG Membership - The Community Liaison Group terms of reference from the resource consent contains an advice note that states 'ongoing membership will be determined by the CLG' - The Templeton Residents Associations have asked if their representation could be increased to three. All active members of the CLG support this increased membership,

and resolved to increase the representation from the Templeton Residents Association to 'up to three members'. - John Cunningham and Cody Cooper were formally welcomed to the group. Fulton Hogan will organise a tour of the quarry for both, ahead of the next meeting.
Update from Fulton Hogan - Noise assessment completed in line with consent conditions, this was submitted to Selwyn District Council and no issues identified - Roughly 300 driver inductions to the quarry have been completed. This is positive and shows an increase in external customers through the gate - Bunds mowed last week - Introduction of Jack Kelliher as Roydon Quarry Manager, as Troy Adamson has moved into new role within Fulton Hogan (Quarries Department Manager) Water use - Nothing to note
Upcoming Changes regarding Management Plans - No upcoming changes regarding management plans to note
Incidents and Complaints - No noted incidents in CAM's since last meeting - No noted complaints since last meeting - Both SDC and ECan have had no complaints in regard to Roydon Quarry - Question asked regarding whether any complaints have been received whatsoever, since quarry becoming operational, at any capacity. Only one of note recalled, regarding a shingle spill, couldn't definitively associate this with Roydon Quarry, but Fulton Hogan remediated, nonetheless. - Discussion had about the visibility of upcoming compliance reporting. The heading in the agendas will be changed to 'Complaints and Compliance activity'. The Councils will be asked at each meeting to give an update on any reports received or audits completed.
Website - Question asked regarding why environmental data is a week behind on the website. Explanation given that upload of readings from sensors is delayed due to checks of live data, to ensure accuracy and simplicity. - Group viewed Roydon Quarry website, sensor and environmental data displayed to assist with above discussion and familiarise new members with content available to public. - Question asked regarding why sensors are placed in specific locations throughout the quarry. Explanation given regarding need to gather data on what is happening outside of the quarry, as well as inside, to ensure any external factors adversely affecting sensor readings are identified and accounted for. - Point raised regarding addition of allowable measurements (consent thresholds) onto air quality graph, for comparison against daily readings. - Over the last 90 days, 277 users had navigated to the website, with 456 views in total (repeat users). - Some live raw data viewed by CLG group to show where website data is refined from.
Community Feedback - No concerns or complaints heard from the Community regarding the quarry. - Some spillage of shingle is noticed by members of the community and raised at bi-monthly community meetings at times, but no way to tell where this comes from. - Templeton Tales edition that was issued has been well received by the community. - Question asked whether of the 300 inductions completed recently, how many truck drivers are external, and how is their access to the quarry controlled if conduct is of concern. Explanation given that most of that 300 would be external and that there is technology in place that monitors things like incorrect truck movements, shingle spills etc,

allowing conversations to be had and consequences to be put in place if required. If driver access was restricted, the barrier arm would not lift for them upon arrival.
Any other matters for discussion from the community - Question raised and discussion had regarding whether the group want to see outcomes of technical reports that are submitted, in line with quarry consenting requirements. - Decision made that CLG group would appreciate seeing a summary document of council submission outcomes, before these are uploaded to the website.
